SOCIAL MARKETING STATISTICS 1995

Highlights

The good news: A total of eight new projects got underway (or crossed through the 10,000 Couple Year of Protection (CYP) minimum) in 1995. Brand new programs in Cambodia, Kazakhstan, Malawi, Mozambique, and Niger got started and three programs, those in Burundi, Rwanda (Refugee), and Ecuador revived after dropping below the 10,000 CYP level in 1994. Another impressive statistic for 1995: Eleven programs served more than 5% of their target markets, up from only six such successful programs in 1994.

None of 1994's programs dropped out, so 1995 saw an impressive total of 54 projects in 50 countries. The near ubiquitousness of contraceptive social marketing in the developing world is beginning to reach United Nations-like proportions.

The not so good news: Despite the addition of the new programs, the total number of couples served increased by only 9%, to 13.9 million. Good progress in many countries was largely offset by a sharp drop in the Egyptian program.

Impressive gains were made in:

- · Equador which has come back with a strong showing in IUD's:
- · Indonesia where good gains in oral contraceptives, injectables and condoms offset a decline in IUD sales;
- Nigeria which increased by over 200,000 CYP's;
- Viet Nam which added nearly 200,000 CYP's to a 1994 base of only 72,000.

Gains of 100,000+ CYP's were also recorded in Pakistan and in the Indian government program where OC sales particularly showed improvement. India's project, however, is still well below levels achieved in the late 1980's. Bangladesh remains the biggest CSM program.

The big drop occurred in Egypt which attained an unsustainable level (1.9 million CYP's) in 1994 as a result of refilling an empty pipeline. Another large program, Colombia, also decreased somewhat in 1995.

The silver lining is that virtually all the of largest programs are now at a realistic level. Indeed several of them, particularly India, Egypt, and Colombia, are low by historical standards. Significant increases between now and the end of the century therefore appear entirely feasible.


