

Phil Harvey Impact Fund

DKT International was founded by Phil Harvey, a visionary in sexual and reproductive healthcare and a lifelong advocate for individual rights and human dignity.

Throughout his career, Phil worked to expand access to healthcare, particularly for communities often overlooked or underserved.

DKT was a beneficiary of Phil's Estate, and through this, was able to grant \$50,000 to each DKT country/regional program. The allocation of these funds was left up to the DKT teams, with simple guidance: **do something that would make Phil proud** and that impacts the kinds of groups or people that are important to the mission of DKT.

Education & Provider Training



India

DKT India supported rural outreach across Uttar Pradesh with community theater, ASHA worker engagement, free medical consultations, and distribution of Choice Pills and Zaroor Plus condoms. The campaign emphasized shared responsibility in family planning and broke taboos around contraceptive use.

Philippines

Over 90 **midwives were trained and equipped** with "starter kits" to deliver contraceptive services in their communities, creating economic opportunity while expanding SRH access.



Vietnam

Through workshops and e-learning programs, DKT Mekong trained over 3,000 pharmacists and OB-GYNs in contraceptive counseling, IUD insertion, and post-abortion care, strengthening Vietnam's reproductive health infrastructure nationwide.

South America

In Brazil, nurses in Pernambuco received training in **IUD counseling and insertion to strengthen local service provision.** In Paraguay, DKT partnered with the Rasmuss Foundation to expand **youth counseling services**, dedicating a new space in Phil Harvey's name.



Mozambique

Nine **training sessions** across eight provinces educated 286 pharmacy technicians on legal, technical, and counseling aspects of safe abortion and post-abortion care, critical in reducing maternal mortality due to unsafe procedures.

Youth-Focused and Community Outreach

East Africa

The youth-focused Kiss sex mobile travels across Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, **reaching underserved communities** with HIV prevention, SRH education, and condom distribution—with energy, creativity, and fun.



Expanding Access to Family Planning & SRH Services

Egypt

Expanding Family Planning in Underserved Areas

In partnership with EFPA, NPC, and UN Women, DKT Egypt rolled out reproductive health convoys across Upper Egypt, trained healthcare providers, and launched a campaign addressing child marriage and women's empowerment.

The initiative now spans seven governorates, bringing sonars, IUDs, and education to remote communities, many for the first time.



Nigeria

DKT Nigeria organized a large-scale outreach in Sokoto, reaching 700+ individuals, including 100 sex workers in brothels, with education and free family planning services. A second initiative in Makoko targeted low-income women, expanding access to LARCs and FP counseling.

Democratic Republic of the Congo

The first-ever Maison des Femmes was built in the Democratic Republic of Congo with support from Phil's fund, alongside equipment donations to clinics in Brazzaville to support victims of domestic violence and SRH services.

Indonesia

DKT Indonesia partnered with the Metta Mama Maggha Foundation in Bali to establish a maternal and neonatal clinic for underserved women, while also funding a children's shelter care for HIV-positive children in Jakarta.

Burundi

In partnership with a local NGO, DKT Burundi launched a **youth center** in Kirundo with a dedicated supply corner offering contraceptive access and stigma-free education to young people.

FWACA

In Senegal, DKT FWACA supported the Ziguinchor Regional Center, which shelters young survivors of rape. The donation provided resources for critical care, protection, and rehabilitation for vulnerable girls rebuilding their lives.

Responding to Humanitarian Crises

Turkey

After devastating earthquakes in Kahramanmaras in February of 2023, DKT Turkey used Phil's fund to open a reproductive health clinic—a beacon of care for a displaced population. The clinic now offers maternal care, IUD services, and **psychological support** to a population deeply affected by displacement and loss.

Latin America North

As part of a broader initiative supporting women migrating through Mexico, DKT used the funds to provide Sayana Press and relief kits to migrants walking from Central America, offering dignity and healthcare in transit.



Myanmar

In response to growing food insecurity, DKT Myanmar is providing emergency food relief and dignity based aid. They have distributed over 5 tons of rice weekly to 400 families living in informal settlements. This humanitarian aid promotes inclusion and dignity while also laying the groundwork for long-term food resilience through community gardening and waste-to-soil training.

Advocacy & Digital Access

carafem (USA)

When digital platforms tried to silence abortion content, carafem used these funds to fight back, partnering with creators, optimizing search visibility, and ensuring access to accurate information on medication abortion.
